COMMAND WORDS

Explain: tell the reader something clearly by giving detailed reasons

Describe: help the reader imagine something by using language creatively

Argue: make a clear case for or against something – don't forget the counter argument!

Persuade: convince the reader to believe your point of view

Compare: point out the similarities and the differences between two or more issues/points/texts/arguments/opinions

Identify: pick out the key things you are asked for.
